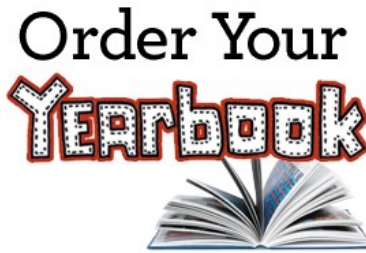

CBA'S TEN CATECHISMS

Question 5: Why was it necessary for Jesus to die?

Answer: Since death is the penalty for sin, Jesus willingly died in our place to give us eternal life. His death delivers those that believe in him from the power and penalty of sin and reconciles us to God. The CBA School Board (CBASB) has revised some policies for the Student Handbook. These revised policies will help encourage our students to receive college credit while still in high school, yet keep a strong, biblical foundation for their classes. We have had some students graduate from CBA with 15+ credit hours towards college, and we hope that many will take advantage of dual credit and early enrollment opportunities.

Dual Credit Policy

CBA offers junior and senior students the opportunity to take college-level courses in high school to those who are academically prepared. A student must have a minimum of a 3.0 GPA to enroll, and some courses may require a minimum ACT/SAT score.

Students must meet the university requirements and pay required fees (these are not a part of CBA tuition, including classes offered on CBA's campus). Applications and more information concerning dual-credit classes offered at CBA can be acquired in the school office.

CBA desires to maintain its integrity in its biblical integration of subjects/materials taught, as recommended by ACSI and the CBASB. *All dual credit classes offered on campus by CBA staff will automatically count toward CBA graduation course requirements with no limitation on the number of credits earned. If a course is taken off campus or online, CBA will accept only one high school credit per year as a dual credit towards CBA graduation course requirements. However, students may take multiple college courses for college credit while in high school (see Early Enrollment).*

CBA will accept high school credit from dual credit classes as long as the following conditions are met:

- The course is listed as "Dual-Credit" on the college course catalog
- The student's enrollment in the course was pre-approved by CBA administration
- **Students enrolled in non-Christian university classes will be required to complete a capstone project demonstrating an understanding of how they integrate their faith into the materials they have learned from the course.**

Students will be awarded one half credit toward high school graduation for each semester course completed for dual credit when compliant with the above conditions.

Early Enrollment Policy

Students may desire to enroll in college courses during their high school years. Many colleges/universities offer early enrollment to high school students for a highly reduced tuition rate. CBA encourages academically motivated students to pursue this option while maintaining their CBA coursework. Early enrollment classes will not count as dual credit classes towards CBA graduation unless it meets the CBA Dual Credit Policy.
